

Jacob Ellis Memorial Scholarship for C-TEC Welding program

The Jacob Ellis Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to one applicant each academic year.

The scholarship is for the full cost of the welding student's fees and/or welding tools for the two-year program and will be paid directly to the student's account upon selection as recipient of the scholarship. The scholarship will be applied to direct costs for schooling (student fees, supplies/tools, etc.).

Eligibility Requirements

- Welding incoming junior
- Watkins Memorial student preferred
- Needs based scholarship (supporting documentation may be required)
- Associate school counselor recommendation
- Display character traits of honor, compassion, kindness, community service oriented, hardworking, and a passion for the welding trade.

Application Process

1. C-TEC Career Development Office will conditionally accept students in the spring
2. C-TEC guidance office will email scholarship application to eligible students
3. Students will apply
4. Applications will be reviewed by a committee of school guidance staff, administration and the Ellis family.
5. Interviews will be conducted by the Ellis family.
6. The recipient and an alternate will be selected by a committee of school guidance staff, administration and the Ellis family.
7. The award will be applied to the student's fee balance or tools at the beginning of each academic year.

Recipient of the Scholarship

1. Notified by C-TEC administration.
2. Accept or decline scholarship.
3. If accepted, C-TEC administration will arrange a time for the Ellis Family to present a certificate in honor of the scholarship to the recipient.
4. If the recipient does not accept the scholarship, the alternate will be awarded the scholarship and the same process will take place.
5. If the recipient withdraws from C-TEC, the scholarship funds will be given to an alternate student
6. If the recipient withdraws from C-TEC, the tools will be donated to another student in need.

Recipient Obligations

- Actively working to complete the Welding program with a minimum GPA of 2.0 and progressing towards their high school diploma.
- Continue displaying character traits which were considered in their selection.
- If the obligations aren't maintained, then a review by the administration and a recommendation to the Ellis family will be conducted concerning the continuation of the scholarship for the recipient.
